Nag-Sankar temple belongs to 4th century AD and it is considered to be constructed by King Nagsankar of Lohitya dynasty. The temple was renovated in 1480 by Ahom King Su-sen-pha. Yet another theory is that the temple was constructed by King Nagmatta. The large pond in the temple is home to varieties of fish and turtles.
